GREEN MEADOW

It has long been the desire of the Parish Council to provide more diverse play equipment to cater for the wide age range of children who use Green Meadow on a daily basis. After completing surveys with both adult community members and children to try to establish what was really wanted, we came up with a plan involving three phases; Phase one being the provision of equipment suitable for pre-school age children, Phase two for children aged 7+ and Phase three the provision of more seating, picnic tables and some form of softscaping to aesthetically enhance the area as a whole.

However, although the Parish Council had funds in its budget towards the project and generous donations from the Jolly Cricketers. Jordans Environment Trust and others had been received, play equipment and the required safety surfacing are extremely expensive and so it was necessary to apply for grants from a number of external funders. We were absolutely delighted when our application to The Lottery run 'Grants for All' and Bucks County Council Local Area Forum (LAF) were successful. This enabled us to purchase equipment that would be user friendly to pre-school children and position it amongst existing equipment suitable for this age group. At the same time the two flat swing seats were replaced with cradles thus effectively

forming a 'Toddler Area' away from the older children.



Unfortunately, our application to fund Phase two; the provision of more physically and mentally challenging equipment for those aged 7+ was unsuccessful. However, we did not want the older children to feel entirely left out, so we also ordered two bird's nest swings and a set of ordinary swings, together with the multi-user zebra seesaw and revolutionary 'spinner'.

You can imagine how pleased we were when recently the LAF agreed to fund the provision of two extra picnic tables and a circular bench seat around the large beech tree in the centre of the meadow thus kicking off the start of our Phase three plans.

Going forward; with Phase one complete and Phase three underway, it leaves only Phase two outstanding. Although further applications for grants from large companies who operate grant schemes are planned during the course of the next year and limited money has been allocated in our budget, there is still a need for contributions from other local businesses but, above all, we need the continued valued support of the community as a whole to make this happen. Therefore, if YOU have any great fundraising ideas then please do let us know.

SEER GREEN PARISH COUNCIL, BUDGET 2014/15

The Parish Council is responsible for Green Meadow playground and equipment, Green Wood, the recreation ground and pavilion, the allotments, the cemetery and war memorial, the street lights, certain grass cutting, tree and hedge maintenance, dog bins and general tidiness throughout the village (we won the Best Kept Village last year). We also comment on planning applications and may give other advice to villagers. In order to undertake these duties we employ a part time Parish Clerk, and the councillors give of their time freely. The cost of these duties is financed out of the council tax which all householders pay, and that part attributable to the parish households is shown separately on your council tax demand.

Each year in order to assess how much money we require, a budget is prepared in October/ November, discussed at the council meetings, and results in the council requesting our share of the council tax income (known as the precept) from the District Council who are responsible for collecting the council tax. For the last three years, like many other councils, we have not increased this precept. However this year we felt we could no longer carry out these duties efficiently without a small increase and we have requested a 2.5% precept increase to £42,000. This unfortunately will result in a slightly larger increase for householders since there has been a reduction in the local tax support scheme from national government.

Our council is not richly endowed with cash but does own certain lands throughout the village mentioned above which cost money to maintain, and from some of which we derive a relatively small income. We budget with the intention that we should earn a small surplus each year to finance longer term projects (recently the war memorial and new play equipment). However this is becoming increasingly difficult, and in common with all public expenditure, the reverse side is tax which we all wish to minimise. This year we have made more economies in our budget so that we hope to earn a small surplus again, which over the years will continue to improve the facilities for all in the village.

Seer Green Gardeners are brightening up the village by planting spring bulbs. "Snowdrops will be planted around the War Memorial shortly and crocuses in the verges near the Parish Church Hall in the autumn." Their Treasurer Alan Perks, said. We have also supported various local projects and charities over time including the new War Memorial last year. The money will be used to purchase a planter for the white gate on Chalfont Road to give a colourful display of flowers when you enter the centre of the village. The Gardeners have kindly agreed to help with the display and the planter will be installed soon.

On 29th June residents of Seer Green will be opening their gardens to the public to raise money for the Thames Valley and Chiltern Air Ambulance. This will be the first time the village as a whole will have had an open gardens event. It is being run by the Seer Green Gardeners, and is supported by the Seer Green and Jordans Community Trust. We have nine sites signed up, but it's not too late to get involved. If you would like to show your garden, then please contact the organiser, Philip Newton, and he'll get your garden on the map.

The event will be from 2.00pm until 5.00pm on the Sunday, and there will be tea and cake available at the Parish Church Hall.

If you'd rather not feature your garden, then you can still help on the day. Volunteers are required to help steward, and make and serve tea and cake. If there are a good number then it won't take up much of your time, and you'll still be able to enjoy the gardens - and get home for the football!
