# AFFORDABLE HOUSING

At 7.00 pm on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July in the Parish Church Hall prior to the main Parish Council meeting, we have Deborah King from the Rural Housing Trust who specialise in arranging provision of affordable housing for local people in rural villages.

Her talk will include the role of the Rural Housing Trust in England and opportunities that may be available to Seer Green, if we so wished, to provide this type of housing.

This is a very important subject and we recommend that villagers attend the meeting and learn and debate this very important and relevant subject.

#### SPEED CONTROL



A volunteer using the Speed Indicator Device (SID) on loan from Bucks CC for a week in March. Your Parish Councillors and volunteers used the SID at various times for a week.

Whilst most drivers were driving sensibly, more than 20%, of drivers many of whom were local residents exceeded 35mph, with several at more than 50mph. The highest speed recorded was 70mph.

Your Parish Councillors would like all the roads in Seer Green outside the 30mph zone to have a speed restriction. A petition for a speed restriction on New Barn Lane has been submitted to Bucks CC for consideration. Seer Green, due to the lack of serious personal injury in recent years, is not considered to be a priority. However, New Barn Lane and the other village roads will be considered as part of the overall speed management strategy review in 2004/05.

# **BOY KNOCKED DOWN BY CAR**

On 13<sup>th</sup> May a car on School Lane, outside Green Meadow, knocked down a young boy. Fortunately the boy suffered no serious physical injury and we understand that the car driver was not to blame.

With the limited car parking near the school, it shows just how easy it is for an accident to take place and the need to take care and be vigilant at all times.

#### DOG WALKERS ALERT!

The 'Dogs Fouling of Land Act 1996' came into effect on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2003, making it a criminal offence to allow your dog to foul on all carriageways (this includes the roads, pavements and grass verges) with a speed limit of 40mph or less. In addition the following areas within the village have been designated under this Act:

Green Meadow Play Area, Jubilee Walkway, Recreation Ground and the Cemetery Entrance.

It is, of course, a common courtesy to not expect others to walk in what your dog leaves behind, but remember, it is now against the law to do so!

#### **PLAYGROUND**

The play equipment in Green Meadow continues to be a much-used asset for the Village.

We have applied for funding to match that provided by the Playground Committee plus an added contribution by the Parish Council. If this funding is successful we will acquire a large piece of play apparatus suitable for Primary aged children.

## **NEW VILLAGE POLICEMAN**

PC Paul Shovelton is the policeman now responsible for Seer Green and Jordans. He can regularly be seen in the village and is getting to know local people.

You may have seen him and other police officers out with the speed gun recently. Initial results indicated that 80% of people exceeding the speed limit lived in the village.
